The Wrecks We Dive THE THUNDERBOLT

The 189 foot Thunderbolt was sunk March 6th, 1986, off Marathon in the Florida Keys. She now lies intact and upright in 120 feet of water with the ship's superstructure at 75 feet.



The Thunderbolt was built in June 1942 and christened as the Randolph. The ship's main function was to build and maintain coastal minefields. She was put into the Navy Marine Reserve Fleet in 1949.

In 1961 the Randolph was sold to a Miami shipping firm. Ultimately, Florida Power & Light bought her for research on the electrical energy of lighting strikes. This is where the name Thunderbolt came from.

The ship was stripped and has only a few pieces of large equipment which consists of a horizontal cable reel at 80 feet, an observa-If you've never attended Ocean Fest, you tion deck at 75 feet, rudder and propellers at

Book review: Underwater "fanta seas"

If the only thing I told you about this month's book is that it is by National Geographic photographer David Doubilet, you would want a copy on your coffee table just because it is by Doubilet. But Water Light Time is not just another "pretty fishies" book. Published in 1999 by Phaidon Press Ltd., this is a book to get lost in...don't pick it up unless you have a few hours on your hands. Haunting and surreal shots

from above, upon, and below the surfaces of all the world's seas show you the ocean realm in a perspective you likely have never experienced. The black-and-white manta shots are considered by many reviewers to be the highlight of the book, but Doubilet's skilled use of light to capture Mother Ocean's brilliant colors will make you wonder if you're looking at a photograph or a painting. I tried to select a favorite photo to tell you about, but I simply cannot...they are all magnificent. Don't deprive your eyes...buy this for yourself or your favorite dive buddy, or check it out @your library like I did!
